# **Overall DBE Three-Year Goal Methodology**

FY 2023-25 (10/1/2022 through 9/30/2025)

#### **EXECUTIVE SUMMARY**

The Charleston County Aviation Authority (CCAA) presents its Federal Aviation Administration (FAA) Disadvantaged Business Enterprise (DBE) goal calculation, documentation, and methodology for the United States Department of Transportation's (USDOT) assisted contracts anticipated for award from October 1, 2022, through September 20, 2025.

This three (3) year goal calculation was prepared in accordance with 49 CFR Part 26, and all relevant USDOT and FAA goal-setting guidance, using the FAA DBE Goal Setting Tool. The USDOT-assisted projects are summarized below and includes the estimated contract amount for each airport owned and controlled by CCAA.

Accordingly, the three-year overall goal established for the FFY2023 – 2025 is **8.8%**, to be accomplished through 4.9% Race-Conscious (RC) means and 3.9% Race-Neutral (RN) means. The total dollar amount to be expended on DBEs is \$3,762,561.00.

The below discusses the methodology used by CCAA to calculate this goal.

#### BACKGROUND<sup>1</sup>

As a recipient of USDOT funds, CCAA is required to establish a DBE Program in accordance with 49 CFR Part 26. Pursuant to USDOT guidelines, the DBE program is to be narrowly tailored to the specific market area to level the playing field for small, minority, and women-owned businesses to participate in federally funded contracts.

#### Methodology and Overall Goal

49 CFR 26.45 requires that the recipient of USDOT funds utilize a two-step process in the development of its overall DBE goal:

**Step 1**: Calculation of a base figure that represents the availability of DBEs ready, willing, and able to work on CCAA contracts.

**Step 2**: Adjustment of the base figure so that the final overall goal represents the amount of participation CCAA might expect in the absence of discrimination or its effects.

<sup>&</sup>lt;sup>1</sup> CCAA contracted with The Nelson Ideation Group, LLC (TNIG) to assist CCAA in developing its Triennial Disadvantaged Business Enterprise (DBE) Goal Methodology for Federal Fiscal Years (FFY) 2023 – 2025 for Charleston International Airport (CHS), Charleston Executive Airport (JZI), and Mount Pleasant Regional Airport (LRO). CCAA and TNIG analyzed the above listed planned projects and determined that sufficient subcontracting opportunities for DBE subcontractors exists for each project.

Based on this methodology, CCAA's Overall Goal for the next three (3) fiscal years (FY 2023-2025) is for **8.8%** of its Federal financial assistance to be expended in DOT-assisted contracts. CCAA anticipates awarding these contracts between October 1, 2022, and September 30, 2025.

#### **MARKET AREA**

According to 49 CFR Part 26:45, the jurisdiction (Market Area) is determined by the geographical area where a majority of the airport's contractors and subcontractors who seek to do business with CCAA are located in the area where the airport(s) spends the majority of its contracting dollars. The South Carolina counties for the Charleston County Aviation Authority are:

#### The base goal projection after weighting is as follows:

Total Weighted DBE Availability: \$3,756,475

Total for All Trades: \$77,021,438

Dividing the weighted DBE totals by the total estimate for all trades gives a base DBE availability figure for the projects anticipated during the goal-setting period. This figure is expressed as a percentage and serves as the basis for the three-year overall goal.

Base of DBE Goal: 4.9%

# **Step 2. Adjustment of the Base Figure:**

One piece of data used to determine the adjustment to the base figure was the median of historical DBE accomplishments, as follows:

Arranging this historical data from low to high (0%, 0%, 12.8%, 13.38%, 21.97%), the median is **12.8%**.

Step 1 Base averaged with historical median: (4.9% + 12.8%) / 2 = 8.8%

To arrive at an overall goal, the Step 1 base figure was added to the Step 2 adjustment figure and the total was averaged, arriving at an overall goal of **8.8%**. (CCAA) believes this adjusted goal accurately reflects DBE participation that can be achieved for the type(s) of work being awarded during this three-year goal period (FY 2023-25).

From the historical data on DBE participation available, Charleston County Aviation Authority believes that slightly higher DBE participation can be obtained during the 3-year period because a significant number of additional firms that perform work are expected to be certified in the local market area. Therefore, Charleston County Aviation Authority is increasing its Step 1 base figure of **4.9%** by 3.9 % for a total overall goal of **8.8%** for FY 2023-25.

# Breakout of Estimated "Race and Gender Neutral" (RN) and "Race and Gender Conscious" (RC) Participation

CCAA will meet the maximum feasible portion of the overall goal by using race neutral means of facilitating DBE participation.

- 1. Arrange solicitations, times for the presentation of bids, quantities, specifications, and delivery schedules in ways that facilitates DBEs, and other small businesses, participation;
- 2. Refer DBEs to small business assistance agencies in overcoming limitations such as inability to obtain bonding or financing;
- 3. Refer DBEs to small business assistance agencies to provide technical assistance and other services;
- 4. Carry out information and communications programs on contracting procedures and specific contract opportunities;
- 5. Refer DBEs to small business assistance agencies for supportive services program to develop and improve immediate and long-term business management, record keeping, and financial and accounting capability for DBEs and other small businesses;
- 6. Inform small businesses in CCAA's MWBE directory of programs the assist them in becoming DBEs, particularly in fields in which DBE participation has historically been low;
- 7. Ensure the distribution of DBE directory, through print and electronic means, to the widest feasible universe of potential prime contractors;

Charleston County Aviation Authority (CCAA) estimates that in meeting the established overall goal of **8.8%**, it will obtain **3.9%** from Race-Neutral participation and **4.9%** through Race-Conscious measures.

This breakout is based on: Calculations of our base goal is 4.9% Adjusted goal based on pass performance was achieved due to over the following:

- In 2015, Race-Conscious over achievement of 1.62%, Race-Neutral under achievement was -1.42%
- In 2016, Race-Conscious under achievement of -6.21%, Race-Neutral under achievement of -1.40%
- In 2018, Race-Conscious under achievement of -10%, Race-Neutral over achievement of 57.71%
- In 2019, Race-Conscious over achievement of 9.28%, Race-Neutral underachievement of -2.11%
- In 2020, Race-Conscious and Race-Neutral were not achieved due to COVID
- In 2021, Race-Conscious and Race-Neutral were not achieved as no AIP projects were awarded

CCAA will adjust the estimated breakout of race-neutral and race-conscious DBE participation as needed to reflect actual DBE participation (see 49 CFR §26.51(f)) and track and report race neutral and race conscious participation separately.

For reporting purposes, race-neutral DBE participation includes, but is not necessarily limited to the following:

- DBE participation through a prime contract obtained through customary competitive procurement procedures,
- DBE participation through a subcontract on a prime contract that does not carry a DBE goal,
- DBE participation on a prime contract exceeding a contract goal, and
- DBE participation through a subcontract from a prime contractor that did not consider a firm's DBE status in making the award.

CCAA will use contract goals to meet any portion of the overall goal that is not expected to be met through RN means. Contract goals are established over the three-year period to which the overall goal applies, they will cumulatively result in meeting any portion of the CCAA's overall goal that is not projected to be met through the use of RN means.

CCAA will establish contract goals on all USDOT-assisted contracts that have subcontracting possibilities and the size of the contract goals will be adapted to the circumstances of each such contract including type of work, availability of DBEs to perform that work, and necessary adjustments to account for market conditions.

CCAA will continue to increase contract opportunities for DBE contractors by participating in small, minority and women-owned outreach events, and communicate their upcoming solicitations with business associations, organizations, chambers of commerce, and small business resource centers in the CCAA Market Area.


